Growing Awareness Urban Farm had a unprecedented and hard year of loss this spring. I sowed



seeds, mixed soil, transplanted seedlings, and filled up our greenhouses like I have for the past 12 seasons. But this year things were off, the plants didn't grow normally— all were stunted and most damaged. After consulting with the Bernalillo County Extension Office, we determined the issue was most likely a contaminant in the purchased compost element of our potting soil. I'm a grower who cares deeply for the health, growth, and quality of the plants I sell and the people they feed, and integrity and transparency are values we try to embody at ECM in all aspects of what we do. Thus, we did not sell any seedlings this spring. It was a confusing and heartbreaking year for me, the plants, and our customers!
